Principals Report:

Calhoun Elementary School Principal Christie Lorsbach Report

The School Improvement Team has updated all goals to align with the district Strategic Plan.

The staff participated in a Teacher's Institute with Jerseyville on Tuesday, Oct. 10th. The takeaways from the training were how to better care for ourselves as educators as we are the leading profession with the highest burnout rate.

We have started 5th /6th and 7th /8th grade girls' basketball seasons. There was a highlight of positive sportsmanship for the Jr. High team on the IESA Facebook page. Kuddos to our players, coaching staff and fans.

Using the current and past NWEA Map testing data, along with the IAR data, staff have developed SMART goals for increased academic achievement for all students in grades PreK-8.

Last Thursday, an all school assembly was held at CEJHS. Our school-wide character education program centers around a 45-minute assembly called The NED Show. NED is a loveable cartoon character whose name is an acronym for Never give up, Encourage others, and Do your best. Teachers love that NED is simple, relatable and kid-focused.

We are currently working with Jersey 100 to host the author, Mr. Kevin Lovegreen. He has written many books geared around the character, Lucky Luke, who participates in many outdoor activities. The content and adventures of these stories directly connects to our students and their experiences.

There has been a family involvement committee developed within the building to begin the process of investigating how we can build better relationships between the school and families, as well as the school and community. The first meeting will be held on Monday, Oct. 16th.

The fencing company has contacted us and should start construction on the new fencing on the west side of the school this week.

We would like to thank Mrs. Debbie Eilerman for her time as a long term sub for Mrs. Murphy. We are excited to welcome a new Warrior to the family and look forward to Mrs. Murphy's return on Monday, Oct. 30th.
